K-2 Reading Partners Students

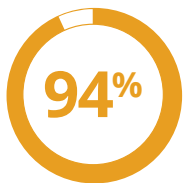
90% MASTERED* THE FOUNDATIONAL READING SKILLS needed to read at grade level.
