PROVEN PROGRAM

- ✓ Gold-standard research shows Reading Partners has a positive and statistically significant impact on student reading proficiency with a high return on investment.

COMMUNITY DRIVEN

- ✓ We partner with schools, community groups, and local volunteers to multiply resources and impact for our students, providing them with twice-weekly, one-on-one tutoring sessions.

INDIVIDUALIZED

- ✓ We place elementary students into our research-based curriculum at the appropriate level and use ongoing assessments to help tailor and focus their tutoring sessions.

READING IS THE FOUNDATION FOR ALL FUTURE LEARNING

Research shows that when students can read at grade level entering fourth grade, they are four times more likely to graduate from high school.



THE NEED IS SUBSTANTIAL AND URGENT

On the 2019 Maryland Comprehensive Assessment Program (formerly PARCC), only 18.8 percent of all fourth graders in Baltimore City were found to be reading at or above grade level.
